

NICK CONDOS, 65, DIES, BOXER AND WRESTLER

STAMFORD, Conn., Nov. 14

— Nicholas Thomas Condos, who, as Nick Condos, was a boxer and wrestler, died Monday in Daytona, Fla., while on vacation. He was 65 years old and lived here at 82 Crystal Street.

Mr. Condos began as a heavyweight fighter in 1930 in New York but soon turned to wrestling and traveled worldwide with the Jim Londos troupe. He once held the record for the quickest pin at Madison Square Garden in defeating Mike Chaplin in 12 seconds in 1933. He also held a Greco-Roman American world title for wrestling.

Among those he wrestled were Strangler Lewis, Gus Sonnenberg, Hans Steinke, Primo Carnera, Sam Stein, Mike Mazurki,

and Gino Garibaldi. During his ring career, he was sometimes confused by the public with Nick Condos, the dancer and former husband of Martha Raye, the comedienne.

Mr. Condos later went into business here. He leaves a brother, Speros.
