

The last Will and Testament of William H
Burks of Mount Pleasant, Westchester County and State
of New York, I William H Burks, Considering the
uncertainty of this mortal life, and being of sound
mind and memory (Blessed be Almighty God for the
same) do make and publish this my last will
and testament in manner and form of following
(that is to say,) First I will and ordain that
my funeral expenses, and all other expenses and
debts be paid out of my personal property,
I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Ann Burks
the Interest of one third of the remainder
of my real and personal estate during her natural
life ~~as long as she shall remain my widow~~
which will be in Lieu of dower. And the
remainder of all my property I give and bequeath
all to my son George Willow Burks to come
in his possession when he shall arrive at the
age of twenty one years.

And I further will that my executor sell my
personal property as soon after my decease
as convenient, and my farm lying in
Unionville Mount Pleasant my said executor
may sell at private sale or Auction the time
and manner to be at his own discretion
And I hereby appoint my son George Willow Burks
my guardian of my son George Willow Burks until he shall

in the age of twenty one years, unto my
father John T. Yerks and the expenses of his
maintenance and education to be paid out
of the money which shall come to him
and I hereby appoint my said father John
T. Yerks my sole executor of this my last
will and testament; In witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal the 16th day of May in the year of our Lord
One thousand eight hundred and fifty five.
