POLICE COURT CASES.

Thomas Condos Fined for Violating the Sunday Law.

Thomas Condos was before Judge Walter H. Clark in the police court yesterday morning, charged with keeping his candy store open a week ago Sunday. John W. Coogan, who appeared for him, filed a demurrer to the complaint. Judge Clark overruled the demurrer. Policemen testified that the place had been kept open. No testimony was offered on the part of the defense. Judge Clark imposed a fine of \$50 and costs.

Joseph Veger, who assaulted Frank Carney by the use of a knife in Charles H. Hale's coal yard on December 12, was fined \$25 and costs and put in the custody of the probation officer for one month that he might raise the money to pay the penalty.

Frank W. Bailey was sentenced to jail for fifteen days, and John O'Neil was sentenced to jail for thirty days, both for drunkenness. Both men had violated the conditions of their probation.

Judgment was suspended in the case against John Torpey, charged with breach of the peace, and the case against Samuel Povnick, charged with being the receiver of stolen property, was further continued to Saturday, it having been originally continued from December 7.
