TOWN TAKES ACTION--The Islip Town Board this week initiated action against a deteriorated structure on Railroad Avenue near Center Street in Sayville. The owner, of the structure, Mrs. Millie Librizzi of Versa Place, Sayville, according to town officials, is to be notified by registered letter that certain conditions at the building, at 5460 Railroad Avenue, are in violation of the Islip Town Fire Prevention Code and must be corrected. These include the need for a general cleanup at the site, securing building windows to prevent further entry and vandalism, the removal or securing of leaders and gutters in front of the building and the removal of existing stucco that is now falling away from the building. These problems, town officials point out, have existed for at least the last four years. If the owner fails to comply with the request, a summons will be served and litigation would follow. Much concern has been expressed by residents of this area concerning the conditions at the building and the threat it poses for a possible fire, which would endanger adjoining structures.



Reading Program provides the scope and sequence for reading instruction, but that a variety of methods and materials are employed to reach instructional objectives with the children.
