

EX-COWBOY MEETS EX-GRIDDER ON EXTRA SPECIAL MAT CARD

Luttrall and Holmberg To Clash; Condos and Young Joe Stecher To Open

Riding high in the wrestling saddle, and with his eye cocked on the throne room now occupied by Jimmy Londos, "Cowboy" Luttrall, wild man of Texas' badlands, storms back into Kingsport Monday night to meet young Oscar Holmberg, sturdy ex-Fordham football tackle, in the featured attraction of a two match card at Sportrena, Sullivan street. Supporting this sterling main event will be a bout between Young Joe Stecher, the scissor king, and Nick Condos, the scholarly Greek. Both bouts will be for two best falls out of three with the top having a 90 minute time limit and the opener 60.

This very villainous Mr. Luttrall, said to be the worst man to emigrate from Texas since the Indians roamed the wide open spaces and half-breed outlaws shot up the border, already has taken a foe in Kingsport. This mammoth man is a splendid wrestler, but he much prefers the brewing style.

Dear Ol' Fordham—
Holmberg, who fought his heart out for dear old Fordham, is a wrestler of no mean ability—a man that can dish it out in gobs and absorb it in large quantities. He is a flying tackle expert, possibly the best on the mat today.

The swashbuckling cowboy is in love with himself—he believes implicitly in his own ability. This master of ego has a lot to back up his confidence and so far he has not lost a match in Dixie. Down Texas way they call him rougher and tougher than Billy Edwards,

Jim Hesslyn or George Zaharias. So far in this section he has proved his class and justified the glowing recommendations that have flooded out of the Lone Star state.

Serious Minded
Young Holmberg, the serious minded sort, is rapidly developing into another star of the first water. His smashing tackle carries enough potency to floor a mule and he is very skilled in the fine arts of hold clamping.

The opening tussle, between two of cauliflower row's prized wrestling stars, should be a corker with Nick Condos, protege of Jimmy Londos, and a graduate of four universities, and Young Joe Stecher, the leg artist of Nebraska, vieing for honors. Nick is a politician part of the time, a student and wrestler the remainder. The Greek holds degrees in political science from the University of Texas, New York University and the University of Athens, Greece. He also holds a Bachelor of Arts sheepskin from St. Edwards College, Texas.

In the past election, Nick led the Greek Democratic party in a drive for votes for President Roosevelt and the New Deal. He was personally recommended for his efforts by Attorney General Cummings, the mayor of Stamford, Conn., and other Democrats high in political circles.

Condos was here last week and gave a great account of himself. He meets a youngster worthy of his steel in Stecher, the gangling, goodnatured, but hard fighting youngster. The styles of two old wrestling masters will cross when these two youngsters meet.

It is a program worthy of the patronage of local fans, and indications are that a large crowd will be present.
