MAY TEST NEW SUNDAY LAWS.

Business men would point to the well filled drug stores and say that the drug business was the smallset part of their Sunday's receipts, and call such a law an injustice.

The police have anticipated that sooner or inter a test case would be made of the new law, for several small store keepers have been talking about such a movement since the law went into effect.
