

Frank A. Tierney, Ex-Police Captain, Ill One Day, Dies

**Retired in 1928 After 28
Years' Service — Once
Ranked as Inspector**

Frank A. Tierney, 69, retired police captain, formerly in charge of the 44th Precinct at Liberty and Miller Aves., died yesterday in St. Mary's Hospital after a day's illness from heart trouble.

He lived at 848 Park Place, but the funeral on Tuesday will be from 1155 E. 39th St., the home of his youngest son, Raymond H., a well known Brooklyn lawyer. It will proceed to St. Gregory's R. C. Church, where a requiem mass will be offered at 9:30 a.m. Interment will be in St. John's Cemetery.

In addition to Raymond H., the survivors include two other sons, John E. and Frank, and three grandchildren.

Mr. Tierney had been a member of the Police Department for about 32 years. He retired in 1928. At one time he held the rank of inspector. He was born in Manhattan, but had lived in Brooklyn most of his life.
