

TO SUE MRS. LAIDLAW.

Her Chinatown Letters to Mayor Resented by Police Officials.

It was announced yesterday by Louis S. Posner, attorney for the plaintiffs, that action would be immediately taken in the libel suit of Police Inspector John Daly and Capt. Frank A. Tierney against Mrs. James Lees Laidlaw, Manhattan Chair-

man of the Woman's Suffrage Party, on account of her letters to Mayor Raynor and Police Commissioner Waldo relating to Chinatown conditions. Policeman Jeremiah Sullivan will also become a plaintiff in the suit, according to Mr. Posner.

Commissioner Waldo has begun an investigation in the matter, which arose out of what Mrs. Laidlaw said in regard to the treatment of Miss Livingston, a settlement worker, who is alleged to have received injuries while at work in Chinatown.
