 Seventh, I give devise and bequeath to my sister Penina Hunter my Double Shawl.
 All the rest, residue and remainder of my property I give devise and bequeath as follows,
 One fifth part thereof to my sister Penina Hunter,
 One fifth part thereof to my sister Catharine Underdunk,
 One fifth part thereof to my sister Ann Grohman,
 One fifth part thereof to the three (3) children of my deceased sister Lucinda Clark equally divided between them share and share alike,
 One fifth part thereof to the children of my deceased sister Jennimina Bailey to be equally divided between them share and share alike.
