

This Certificate and Return of Marriage must be made to the Registrar of Records, 301 Mott St., New York, within 10 Days after the Marriage Ceremony.

(Extract from the Statutes.)

"It shall be the duty of Clergymen, Magistrates, and other persons, who perform the Marriage Ceremony in the City of New York, to keep a Registry of the Marriages celebrated by them, which shall contain as near as the same can be ascertained, the names and surnames of the parties married, the residence, age, and condition of each; whether single or widowed.

(From § 18, Chap. 74, Session Laws, 1866.)—"And for every omission of any person to make and keep the registry required by the acts referred to in this section, and for every omission to report a written copy of the same to said Board within ten days after any Birth or Marriage provided to be registered, any person guilty of such omission shall be liable to pay a fine of ten dollars, which may be sued for and recovered in the name of said Board."
