# HEALTH DEPARTMENT OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK

Has made the following Order:

All Permits for the removal of the body of any deceased person from the City of New York for Interment, and all Burial Permits, and Permits for the Disinterment of the body of deceased persons in the City of New York, shall be granted and signed by the Register of Records.

The Physician who attended any person in a last illness is responsible for the presentation of this Certificate, accurately filled out, to the BUREAU OF VITAL RECORDS, within 36 HOURS after said person's death. (Sec. 161 of Sanitary Code.)

NO PERMIT FOR BURIAL CAN BE OBTAINED WITHOUT A PROPER CERTIFICATE.

All physicians practising in New York City (including those in public institutions) are required to register their names in the Bureau of Vital Statistics. (Sec. 5 of Sanit. Code.)

Law regulating Coroners' Inquests in the County of New York, Chapter 462, Laws of 1871.

Section 1.—Hereafter, when in the City and County of New York, any person shall die from criminal violence, or by a casualty, or suddenly, when in apparent health, or unattended by a physician, or in prison, or in any suspicious or unusual manner, the Coroner shall subpoena a properly qualified physician, who shall view the body of such deceased person externally, or make an autopsy thereon, as may be required (preparatory to an inquest).

N.B.—The Superintendent of Vital Statistics cautions all persons against accepting or using this Certificate for any purpose except that of delivering it for a Burial Permit Registration. In case of the issuance of a duplicate Certificate, the word "Duplicate" should be written across it.
