MRS. WILLIAM E. YERKS

Mrs. Mary Stimson Yerks, wife of William E. Yerks, retired lumber merchant, died this morning at 7:25 o'clock at the Doctors' Hospital, New York City, after a protracted illness. Mrs. Yerks, who was sixty-seven years of age, resided at 180 Hudson Terrace.

Born in New York City on June 8, 1870, a daughter of the late George C. and Mary Robinson Stimson, Mrs. Yerks was brought to Yonkers as a child of twelve. She attended School Six and was graduated from Yonkers High School. She moved with her family to Jersey City and Philadelphia, coming back to Yonkers about 35 years ago.

Before her marriage to Mr. Yerks on June 30, 1903, in the First Methodist Church here, she studied for the concert stage and gave several performances in New York City. She was a member of the Clio Club of this city, a former manager of the Baptist Home for the Aged in Spuyten Duyvil and a member of the Baptist Church of the Redeemer.

Surviving besides her husband are two daughters, Gertrude S. and Isabel M. Yerks of Yonkers, and a sister, Mrs. H. B. Odell of Pittsburgh.

The Rev. H. Otheman Smith, pastor of the Baptist Redeemer Church, will conduct funeral services at the home Tuesday at 2 P. M. Interment will take place in Mount Hope Cemetery.
