 of the town of Mount Pleasant in the County of Westchester and State of New York do hereby make publish and declare this my last will and testament as follows viz
 First - I give and bequeath to my husband Henry Yorks the use or interest of all my property both Real and Personal and I also give him

full and unqualified right power and authority to sell all or any part of the same at any time that he may deem it necessary for his own comfortable support through life and to use as much of the proceeds of such sale as he may think proper for his own personal comfort. I also direct that his debts and funeral expenses shall be paid out of any of said funds that may remain after his decease.

Second In case there should be enough money left after the above directions are fulfilled then I bequeath to my son Charles Yorks one hundred Dollars and to my Grand daughter Sarah Esthay Twenty Five dollars and all residue apportioned to all my surviving children each have an equal share.

And Lastly I hereby appoint the said Henry Yorks the Executor of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all former Wills by me made.
