all the rest. Residue and remainder
of my property I give, devise, and
bequest as follows. One fifth part
thereof to my sister Penina Hunter
One fifth part thereof to my sister Catherine
Oudendouk. " One fifth part thereof to
my sister Ann Grohau " "
One fifth part thereof to the three (3) children
of my deceased sister Lucinda Clark
equally divided between them share and
share alike " One fifth part thereof to the
children of my deceased sister Jennima
Bailey to be equally divided between them
share and share alike

Moses W. Taylor and } my Executors of this
John E. Bailey }
